



Resolution  
Of the Sixth Congressional District Committee  
of the Republican Party of Virginia  
September 17, 2016

Whereas, At times, during Lame Duck Sessions of Congress, Congressional leaders bring up for a vote legislation that might not be approved in a Regular Session of Congress; and

Whereas, Legislation that is substantive should be debated and voted on during a Regular Session of Congress. That process allows Representatives and their constituents reasonable time to read the proposed law and consider its effect; therefore, be it

*Resolved*, The Sixth Congressional District Committee of the Republican Party of Virginia calls on Representative Robert Goodlatte to vote against any legislation over 100 pages, such as an Internet Sales Tax, the Trans-Pacific Partnership and an omnibus spending bill, if such legislation is brought to the Floor of the House of Representatives during the 2016 Lame Duck Session of Congress.

The Secretary of the Sixth Congressional District Committee of the Republican Party of Virginia is directed to convey this Resolution to Representative Bob Goodlatte.
